BCA Hosts Contractor's Certification Course

BCA CALLS FOR URGENT ESTABLISHMENT OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS BOARD



Bahamian Contractors Association (BCA) President Leonard Sands has emphasized the urgent need for the Construction Contractors Board (CCB) to be established, welcoming the announcement that Prime Minister Philip Davis plans to meet with the construction industry to hear its concerns.

The Construction Contractors Act, long-awaited by the industry, provides critical protection for consumers, including a builders' defects compensation scheme, a dispute resolution mechanism, and a consumer code. Despite the legislation being in place, the board responsible for day-to-day regulation has yet to be appointed.

A recent visit with Prime Minister Davis, PM Davis acknowledges the importance and urgency, "This is very encouraging," Sands said. "It is urgent that we conclude this matter and have the board appointed. The BCA has submitted the names of persons we recommend, and all necessary submissions from other industry groups have been made."

Sands stressed the importance of the board, likening it to the medical board, which protects the public and ensures accountability. He noted that the construction sector, the country's third-largest industry, requires a functioning regulatory body to address grievances, ensure standards, and protect consumers.

Sands expressed optimism that the appointment of the board will happen soon, marking a significant step forward for the industry

Guest Speaker: Minister Keith Bell

Minister Keith Bell addressed a packed room of contractors and construction professionals during the Bahamian Contractors Association's (BCA) monthly luncheon held at The Balmoral on September 24th.

In his remarks, Minister Bell spoke to growing concerns regarding rising rental costs and the shortage of affordable housing for Bahamian families. He noted that the government is actively considering amendments to existing legislation aimed at controlling rent prices. "I've seen, very recently, a significant increase across the board of landlords raising rents. I've spoken to the Minister of Economic Affairs, Michael Halkitis, who is responsible for rent and rent control," Minister Bell said.

At the same time, he emphasized that any changes must also ensure landlords are not left at a disadvantage.

Minister Bell highlighted the government's rent-to-own program as a key initiative to help Bahamians achieve homeownership, particularly those unable to meet traditional deposit or mortgage requirements. Minister of Housing and Urban Renewal Keith Bell Presents Contractors Training Certificates

During the monthly meeting held in September Minister Bell presented certificates to contractors participating in the BCA General Contractors course which was facilitated by industry renown consultant and President of Veritas Consultant company, John Michael Clarke





Climate Change Representative from Italy also presented at the BCA Weekly meeting.

Rent-to-own homes are now in Sir Lynden Pindling Estates, in Central Pines, Spring City in Abaco, and in New Providence," he said. "And now, if you notice, the condominium-style buildings at Renaissance are well on their way as part of our full-scale rollout."



BCA Calls for Urgent Appointment of Construction Contractors' Board



The Bahamian Contractors Association (BCA) is calling on government to move swiftly on the appointment of the Construction Contractors

Board (CCB), a long-overdue step required by

law to regulate the industry.

In August, the BCA met with Prime Minister Philip Davis to stress the urgency of the matter. BCA President Leonard Sands reminded members that the Prime Minister pledged the Board would be in place by the end of September.


"The Construction Contractors Board must be established with urgency," Sands said.



Why the Board Matters?

The Construction Contractors Act was designed to:

- Protect consumers through a builders' defects compensation scheme
- Provide a consumer code of practice
- Offer dispute resolution via mediation and arbitration
- License and regulate contractors just like architects, engineers, and electricians



The BCA has already submitted its list of nominees, along with other industry associations. Sands stressed that the composition of the Board is outlined clearly in the Act, and there is no reason for delay.

"The Construction Contractors Board is just as important as the Medical Board," Sands emphasized. "Without it, contractors and consumers remain without proper recourse or protection."

The BCA will continue to press for the immediate establishment of the CCB, ensuring that contractors and the Bahamian public benefit from a modern, regulated, and accountable construction industry.
